VOLKS TORQUE



Things the manual tells you, and some it doesn't! Beetle Door Handle Locks:

Older Volkswagen door locks have often succumbed to repeated use of the key with now worn keys and internal levers or even attempts at forced entry at some time in the car's life.

You may find a locksmith with the necessary replacement levers and springs to able to cut a new key to the original profile but the cost for the time taken can hit the wallet hard! Fortunately, replacement handles, complete with new keys and locks, are available for reasonable cost and the changeover is simply a matter of removing one screw from the door (It's the top one under the door seal by the catch) and easing the handle out and putting the new one in, complete with the new seals that come with the handles and replacing and tightening the screw.

But what if you discover, like me, that the new handle doesn't quite fit the door profile as it should and the seal has a small gap even when the handle is tightened? Or you simply prefer the original operating lever to the replacement. The chrome on my door handles was in good condition so the answer was to swap the lock cylinder in the new handles with the worn ones in the originals.

With an 'old 'handle on the bench note that the cylinder is held in place on the handle by a screw. You will also see the spring that returns the key to the centre position. Note how it is located. Make a sketch or take a photo so you do not forget. It will only work properly that way! Now insert the key into the lock and watch how it works. Undo the screw, slowly release the spring noting how it fits. Slowly, remove the lock barrel and key as a unit. DO NOT REMOVE THE KEY!

If you do, the tiny springs that work the levers in the lock will fly out and apart from the risk to eyes, ears and mouth they have the ability to go a remarkable distance and its almost certain you will not find them all! An inconvenience with the old lock but if that happens with the new lock you have just given yourself an hour or so's work finding enough springs to make one good working lock and lining up the levers to fit the new key. This is where the internet comes in handy to show you how to do it!!


Place this lock barrel and key to one side and repeat the exercise on the new handle.

Now all you need to do is to slide the new lock barrel and key into the 'old' handle and replace its spring in the same position that it came out of and tighten the assembly with its screw.

Again, it is essential to keep the key in the barrel until it is in its handle and the assembly completed. You now have a nice original working door handle with its new lock and key. The new door key won't match the ignition lock (if the old one *was* the original along with the ignition lock) but a separate key for ignition and doors is not a problem. Just file a notch in one of them to make identification easy in the dark or when in a hurry.




From The Bookshelf

What is the last place you would expect to come across a Volkswagen Book? How about the Queensland Rail Museum at Ipswich? After the club run to Queens Park a couple of months ago I drove the short distance to the Railway Museum to renew my annual subscription and to have a quick look at the book, DVD and gift section they have in a corner of their café. To my surprise tucked away in a corner of the bookshelf I discovered this "Volkswagen Beetles and Buses – smaller and smarter" by Russell Haynes.



Published in 2020 in the USA it contains a comprehensive account of Volkswagens rise from the ashes of WWII to a worldwide manufacturer of these iconic vehicles.

Of course the subject has been covered by many authors but this is certainly one of the better accounts and is full of interesting photographs as well as being very easy to read as the author takes us from the pre-war trials to the prototype electric versions of the Kombi.

Insuring your VW

With my Beetle nearly ready for the road I set about obtaining insurace for it and discovered some surprising things and some traps for the unwary.

The first thing I found is that very few Insurers want anything to do with older cars other than offering third party only cover and some, including a well known Queensland motoring organisation, will not even offer that! Most of those that do offer comprehensive cover only do so for the 'market value', which for classic roadworthy VW's is insultingly low – about what is currently being asked for candidates for the scrap yard! I have a 1976 Australian 1600 Beetle but would you believe that it does not exist on many company computers and is therefore uninsurable! But a 1976 1600 'L'Bug does! Seeing as how the L Bug 1600 and the last 1600 Aussie Beetles are identicle from the windscreen back it makes no sense at all that many companies that advertise heavily on TV will insure one but not the other!

The next port of call was the Insurance Companies "Find an Insurer" web site which lists those insurers that do offer Classic Car Insurance. Again I ran into the problem of my car not being listed on their computers after having completed a lengthy application form for a quote and talking with a 'consultant.' Other listed Insurers sites noted that they had "temporally suspended" their classic car insurance pending internal reviews.

So, it was off to our long time sponsor *Shannon's*. What a difference! No problems with getting comprehenively covered and they do an agreed value of up to \$30,000 without an inspection. Over that amount requires a valuation at their Eagle Farm depot for residents in the Brisbane area.

The cost was also very reasonable and was lower than my 'daily driver' valued at much less than the now restored Beetle. By all means 'shop around' for your classic car insurance but I am sure that Shannon's will be very hard to beat both for price, coverage and service in event of a claim. After my experience Shannon's can be Highly Recommended!
